

Glasgow Archers 252 Progression Award



Rules

- 1... Six sighters followed immediately by three dozen scored arrows. Arrows to be shot at the appropriate distance on a 122cm face.
- 2... When shooting recurve, a minimum score of 252 is the qualifying score for the award at each distance. Scores needed for compound, longbow/traditional styles and barebow are given in the table below.

- 3... Scores must be witnessed and verified by a senior club member (over 18).
- 4... Scores should be submitted to a member of the committee as soon as possible after achieving the score.
- 5... To prove consistency, the required score needs to be achieved **twice** to qualify for the appropriate award and progress to the next distance.
- 6... **IMPORTANT:** Your score is always based on the **Imperial scoring method**. This is 5-zone scoring on a standard 122cm diameter face where scores are 9, 7, 5, 3, 1. So the maximum score possible = 324. Distance shot can be the appropriate metric or imperial distance as shown below, its your choice.

(Pro tip ... pick yards except at 80 and 100 yards when you should go with 70 and 90m. For those not familiar with imperial measurements, its cause they're mostly closer!)

Additionally, a score from a consecutive three dozen arrows can also be submitted if the three dozen was part of another recognized scored round. So if you shoot a lights out 3 dozen@60yrds as part of a competition (*and its the red medal you wish to apply for*), feel free to submit this for consideration. Just remember it needs to be imperial scoring, not metric. Evidence of the score with the relevant three dozen arrows clearly identified should be submitted to a committee member.
